Tunnel field is the highest airport in the northern hemisphere—elevation, 9,200 feet.

Here we furnish good meals and comfortable sleeping accommodations. There are also available saddle horses, pack animals and a guide service for those wishing to visit Rocky Basin lakes, Rock creek, Kern River, Golden Trout creek and numerous other points of interest—all easily reached within a short horse back ride from this centrally located camp.

Excellent stream fishing for golden trout may be had a short distance from camp and a comfortable horse back ride takes you to some of the best lake and stream fishing in the West. Beautiful scenery predominates and, in season, the deer hunter will find this to be a well chosen spot.

* FROM LONE PINE

For those wishing to fly in from Lone Pine, Sierra Airways with planes piloted by Lloyd Downs, will bring passengers to the Tunnel field.

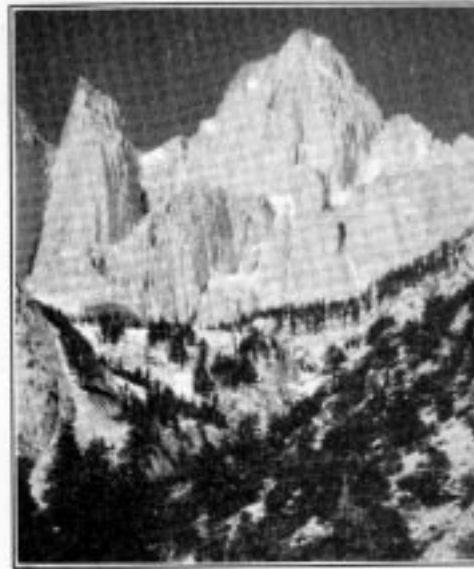

Carrol Creek Pack Station

Located ten miles
southwest of Lone Pine

HERE ONE OF our large pack outfits is stationed, ready at all times to transport you over safe, scenic trails into the heart of this great country of recreation and relaxation.

Carrol creek is the ideal starting point for fishing and hunting trips into the back country.

—Golden Trout Camp—

A short ride of 3 and one-half hours takes you to Golden Trout Camp, located on Cottonwood creek at an elevation of 10,000 feet. Excellent meals and comfortable beds are furnished at reasonable prices here, as well as fully equipped housekeeping cabins for those who prefer them.

Two miles above Golden Trout Camp are the 10 Cottonwood lakes noted for their excellent Golden trout fishing.

—Over Army Pass—

From here the trail continues over Army Pass and down the west slope to Rock creek lakes. From Rock creek lakes the trail winds down Rock creek, taking you in and out of deep, luxuriant meadows, dotted with innumerable wild flowers, and thru the cool fragrant of stately pine forests. The trail hugs the creek and from his saddle the vacationist may observe the glistening bodies of the sturdy Golden trout swimming about in the pools.

About four miles from the lakes, down Rock creek, the trail branches or forks. One trail goes to Mt. Whitney and then joins the famous Muir trail, leading to the headwaters of the Kern and on to Yosemite. The other trail, turning south, leads over Siberian pass into the Golden Trout creek and the Kern River country.

—Over Mulkey Pass—

Lone Pine area of the High Sierra is also a favored hunting ground. For the deer hunter there are Red Rock and Cold Meadows, Mulkey, Ramshow and Potholes areas, and Little Whitney and Templeton Meadows. All of these districts are well populated with Black Tail deer. In addition, several other nearby areas are well known to hunters. Bear are numerous in the late fall.

The trail over Mulkey pass is the shortest, most direct route which may be taken to reach this famous hunting area, altho it may also be reached over Cottonwood pass.
