



STOCK raising in Owens Valley, has long been one of its principal sources of revenue.

The fine quality of the alfalfa and grasses grown here, favorable climate, pure water, with mountain range, guarantee to the stock raiser that perfection only obtained under most favorable conditions. Approximately 25,000 head of cattle, mostly Durhams and Herefords, are owned by the Cattlemen's Association of Inyo County.

This country is also the best in the world for the raising of hogs, cholera among them being unknown.

THE soil, climate and altitude are especially favorable for the growing of pears and grapes, and with a sky seldom clouded during the growing and ripening season, all the common garden and field vegetation grow to perfection.



The altitude, ranging from 3000 to 4500 feet, coupled with the crisp winters and the clear sunny summers, produces an apple that for size, color and flavor keenly rivals the best product of Washington, Colorado or Oregon.
