



TOP CENTER—Mt. Whitney, 14,496 feet above sea level, highest peak in continental United States. The Smithsonian Institute's stone shelter house on the summit is but 14 miles air-line from Lone Pine's Main Street. Whitney's jagged spires may be attained from Whitney Portal at an altitude of 8,300 feet via 12 miles of excellent trail.

TOP LEFT—One of the several chemical plants on the shores of Owens Lake, now a dry lake-bed of rich saline minerals. Payrolls of these industrial plants and nearby talc and metallic mining operations swell Lone Pine's annual income.

LOWER LEFT—Cattle grazing against the majestic back-drop of the High Sierras on Spainhower ranch adjacent to Lone Pine. Mt. Whitney, left back-ground. Stock raising continues as one of Southern Inyo's major enterprises. Herefords predominate, although in recent years Durhams and Brahmans have been successfully introduced. There are extensive cattle ranges from Olancha in the south of Inyo, northward to Bishop, along the High Sierras.



LOWER CENTER—Trout abound in all nearby streams. Lone Pine, "The Heart of the Golden Bear," is nationally famous as the most accessible point to pack into the chain of 11 Cottonwood Lakes and numerous tributaries, the original habitat of famous Golden Trout. Lone Pine is one of eastern California's most popular pack-train outfitting points for hunting, fishing and scenic jaunts into the High Sierras.

TOP RIGHT—Death Valley dunes. Death Valley, the lowest point in the western hemisphere places Inyo County in the unique position of containing both the highest and lowest points within its borders. Death Valley is but 78 miles from Lone Pine via State Route No. 190 over an all-oiled road through the historic Panamint mountains.

LOWER RIGHT—Movies on location in the Alabama Hills, one mile westerly from Lone Pine. The beauty of the fantastic rock formations of the Alabamas yearly attracts motion picture studios where such recent productions as "Tycoon," "Loves of Carmen," "Panhandle," and the Hopalong Cassidy series were filmed.
