## The Land of Hidden Lakes

**T**HE "hidden lakes" of the Bishop Creek basin have for many years been the retreat of mountain lovers and sportsmen who, in the seclusion of these unfrequented spots, find solace and contentment together with the rarest of sport.

Within a few miles of PARCHER'S RAINBOW CAMP are more than a score of these lakes, all of which provide excellent trout fishing.

Some of these lakes are found in granite pockets above timberline, surrounded by rugged peaks of the Sierra's crestline. Others lie on pine-shaded benches. All are reached by good trails. Saddle animals are available to those who prefer riding to hiking.

Long Lake, one of the most beautiful lakes in the High Sierra country is three miles from camp, one mile over an automobile road and two miles over a good trail. This, and adjoining lakes, are well stocked, and the fisherman who likes variety may fish in half a dozen lakes in a single day's hike.

South Lake and Weir Lake are on the automobile road about one mile from the camp. Above South Lake is the South Lake glacier, one of the largest "unexplored" glaciers of the southern Sierra.

The above map shows the location of the different lakes in relation to the camp, and the variety of trout to be found in each lake. The views give an excellent idea of the surrounding country.

### Fish and Game Seasons

**Trout Season** opens May 1st and closes Oct. 31 on all varieties except Golden. Bag limit—25 trout, or 10 pounds and one trout.

**Golden Trout Season** opens July 1st and closes Sept. 30th. Bag limit—20 per day, none under five inches.

**Deer Season**—Sept. 16, Oct. 15.

Strict observance of Fish and Game Laws and co-operation with U. S. Forest Department in prevention of fires is urged.
