



CAMP SCENES

A Vacation Away From the Crowd

LOCATED in one of the most rugged and majestic spots in the Sierra Nevadas, enclosed by massive peaks and terraced cliffs, in the shadow of which nestle the glacier-fed "hidden lakes" so highly regarded by trout fishing enthusiasts, PARCHERS CAMP appeals, especially, to city dwellers and sportsmen who like to spend their vacations in the high mountain country, away from the crowds.

PARCHERS is located in the Bishop Creek area of the High Sierra, about twenty miles from the town of Bishop, which lies in Inyo County, at the head of the Owens River Valley. Leaving the state highway at Bishop the drive up Bishop Creek to the camp is made over a good mountain road.

The camp is situated on a pine-sheltered bench with Green Creek and Bishop Creek running through the grounds.

In nearby meadows wild flowers are abundant and the varied formations of the mountain sides make a veritable paradise for the artist, the camera enthusiast and the geologist.

The altitude of the camp is 9000 feet. There are no rattlesnakes or poison oak.
