

the foreground and the array of jagged peaks in the background is all that can be desired for rugged grandeur. The trail then zigzags down about 1500 feet to Vidette Meadow at the floor of the East Vidette, a favorite camping spot of many. There is fine scenery in every direction and the brook is stocked with golden trout. From this meadow one may go southeastward across Shepherd Pass to the upper Kern or may follow down Bubb's Creek, a lovely stream abounding in good camping places and containing an abundance of rainbow trout. Within a few miles one may ascend a branch trail to East lake, only a short distance from the splendidly rugged King's Kern Divide. Fishing in the lake is good and if one cares for mountain climbing this is the point to scale Mt. Brewer, for view of one of the finest peaks in the Sierra. One may return again to the main trail and continue descending until he reaches the South Fork of the King's River into which Bubb's Creek empties.

An alternative at Bullfrog Lake is to go several miles westward toward Charlotte Lake to the base of a trail leading over Glenn Pass to the Rae Lake region. Probably there are no more beautiful lakes in all the Sierra than Rae Lakes—a chain of 6 lakes—there is certainly none with a more wildly rugged setting of lofty, roughly-hewn mountains. There is also no finer fishing in the Sierra than this vicinity affords. Adjoining it to the west is Sixty Lake Basin, an interesting and not very frequently visited region.

From the Rae Lake group the trail follows Arrow Creek to its junction with Woods Creek. There it forks, one branch leading down stream to Paradise Valley and the South Fork of the Kings—two of the most delightful Yosemite-like canyons of the southern Sierra. By following this trail one may return to Kearsarge Pass by Bubb's Creek. The other fork from the junction leads back within a few miles to the crest of the Sierra past the Woods Lakes, a beautiful group just below Sawmill Pass, by which he may return to Owens Valley. If still unsatisfied he may swing around a mountain to the north to the Upper Basin of the South Fork of the Kings River, a fascinating but seldom-visited region.

The average party will require a saddle horse and 1 pack mule per person, at \$1.50 per day each.....\$ 3.00
(A pack mule carries 150 pounds.)

If packer is required, \$5.00 per day, \$1.50 per day for horse..... 6.50

A party of 4 for 1 day with packer, \$4.65 each,..... 18.50

A party of 4 for 1 day without packer, \$3.00 each..... 12.00

Burros are furnished those who wish to hike, per day..... .75
(A burro will carry 80 pounds.)

If desired, I can pack you in and take you to some place of your choice and return for you at a specified time.

If you wish a change of scenery or new hunting and fishing grounds, it is recommended that you take packer or guide with you.

It is customary for party to furnish own tent, bedding and camp equipment.

Furnished cottages on camp grounds, with hot and cold shower bath, and rest rooms are available in connection with pack train.

The camp is situated on the main highway at Independence.
