The Fourth Recess of Mono Creek

NOWHERE is the "Trail Call" more appealing and insistent than in California. Stretching the entire length of the state the Sierra Nevada Mountains comprise a wealth of scenery unsurpassed in majesty and beauty. Mighty peaks thrust their snow-covered summits 14,000 feet into a wondrous sky of blue. Deep canyons hold great glaciers which are sources of innumerable brawling streams that furnish rare sport for the fisherman. Virgin forests abounding in game clothe the slopes; the whole constituting a vacationland without a peer.

Rock Creek Lodge is located in the very heart of this wonderland surrounded by the Rock Creek Lakes, over thirty in number, eight of which can be reached by automobile, the rest but a short walk from the car.

From the Lodge one can make a different trip every day to a new spot and always find lakes of varying size and beauty. Among the points to be visited are the famous Valley of Lakes, Hilton Lakes, Tamarack Lakes, Ruby Lake and the Golden trout lakes of Morgan Creek and Pine Creek.

By a short auto drive guests may visit the Owens River and Gorge, where many deep pools are to be found, abounding in trout of good size. Hilton, McGee, Convict and Hot Creeks, Whitmore Plunge and Geysers are but a short distance beyond this point.

Back Country

Saddle and pack horses are available at reasonable rates for trips into virgin back country. The trail crosses Mono Pass and descends into the Mono Creek basin, where there are numerous Alpine lakes and mountain meadows. During the summer months the meadows are vast carpets of wild flowers. This country includes the famous Pioneer Basin, Vermillion Valley, the Fourth Recess, Mono Creek, Bear Creek, and the south fork of the San Joaquin. This trip will inspire and fascinate the most experienced mountaineer and vacationist alike.
