### COST

#### 13-DAY OUTING IN CAMP

Adults and children 5 and over.....\$27.00

#### 6-DAY OUTING IN CAMP

Adults and children 5 and over.....\$13.00

Transportation not included.

Note: Because of lack of "home comforts," registration of children under 5 years not encouraged. Prices given on request.

Thirteen-day Outing—Arrive in camp on Sunday after lunch and leave a week from the next Saturday after breakfast.

Six-day Outing—Arrive in camp on Sunday after lunch and leave camp the next Saturday after breakfast.

### Transportation

Southern Pacific to Lone Pine and from Lone Pine to camp by stage.

Approximate cost of transportation—Adults \$31.50; children \$17.00. Berth extra.

Private automobile—Dirt road from Mojave.

Payment required as follows:

6-day outing .....\$13.00 on registration  
 13-day outing .....\$15.00 on registration

Payment in full must be made not later than seven days before arrival shown under "OUTINGS."

No refund given to persons leaving camp before end of registered outing.

### Accommodations

HOUSING—Clean, attractive tent cabins with wooden floors and sidewalls. Each cabin contains chairs, cupboards, mirror and table.

BEDS—Comfortable individual iron cot with mattress. We provide blankets, sheets and pillows. Campers must bring one warm double blanket.

TOILET ARTICLES—Campers are required to provide own towels, soap, etc. We provide individual wash basins.

DINING ROOM—Enclosed with screen and canvas.

MEALS—Appetizing, wholesome, well-cooked food is served. Camp capacity is 75. Early registration advisable.

### Activities and Pastimes

SPORTS—Unexcelled fishing (catching is good); over-night hikes and horseback rides to high peaks and distant lakes; hiking and nature study trips; snow sledging (some distance from camp); croquet, volley ball, horse-shoes, baseball and other similar games.

AUTO TRIPS—Transportation to nearby points of interest will be provided by camp management at minimum cost.

EVENING PASTIME—The chats, stories, songs and entertainments around the evening fire are most interesting and add greatly to one's pleasure.

### Management

The Recreation Department of the City of Los Angeles has established Camp High Sierra as its third mountain recreation camp, and by so doing has opened up an unexcelled vacation country to thousands of Angelenos. This camp is a real outdoor camp and has a special appeal to nature lovers. It is primarily for those who enjoy the rugged mountainous country and are anxious to "rough it" a little.
