

TAMARACK LODGE

Located in the pine forest, right on the shore of Twin Lakes at an elevation of 8600 feet, Tamarack Lodge always knows the tang of mountain air. With its rustic lobby, fireplace and dining room, its comfortable guest rooms and cabins for nearly one hundred guests, its genuine hospitality and the excellence of its dining room service, the lodge has enjoyed a select and rapidly increasing patronage. Two and three room cabins with modern plumbing, also lodge rooms with private bath, are among the new attractions for the season of 1929. Formerly owned by Miss Mary E. Foy, Tamarack, it is now under the management of Lloyd B. Austin, also well known as the popular host at Switzer-Land in the Sierra Madres.

OUTINGS FOR EVERYBODY

For the trout fisherman, there is genuine sport in all the nearer lakes and in the San Joaquin River and its tributaries. Duck Lake and Fish Creek are famed for limit catches of Golden Trout. Boating is provided on all the larger lakes. Good riding and pack horses can always be secured near the lodge, with or without guides. The hiker will find no end of challenging trails leading to surrounding peaks and ridges. Then there are most interesting motor trips to the Earthquake Crack, Minaret Summit, the "Ghost City" of Bodie, Mono Craters and nearby hot springs and geysers; while for rest in deep woods among Alpine lakes and flower gardens Tamarack offers California's best.

THE NEW HOUSEKEEPING CAMP

A number of new one and two-room cabins and tent cabins completely equipped for light housekeeping have been erected on grounds near the lodge, for the accommodation of guests preferring to do their own cooking.
