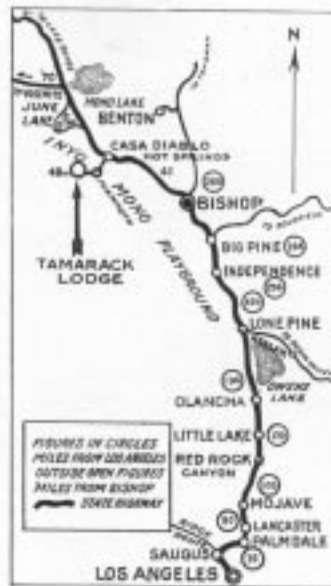


HOW TO REACH TAMARACK

The drive of 330 miles from Los Angeles, nearly all over paved or oiled roads, is now easily made in one day, or comfortable over-night accommodations can be secured at the Dow Hotel at Lone Pine, the Winnedumah at Independence, the Kittie Lee at Bishop, or at other points en route. At Hot Creek, 41 miles beyond Bishop, take road to left via Mammoth to Twin Lakes, 7½ miles. Guests from the north can make direct stage connections from Lake Tahoe or from the Yosemite by way of the Tioga road to Mono Lake, thence by the Bishop-Mono stage to Tamarack Lodge.

Passenger service is provided by the Yellow-way Stage leaving Los Angeles for Bishop daily at 9:30 a. m., also at week-ends at 9 p. m., and by the Bishop-Mono Stage from Bishop to Tamarack Lodge daily at 2 p. m., also at week-ends at 7 a. m. The S. P. train leaves Los Angeles tri-weekly at 11 p. m.
