While the Owens River Valley is a part of the great State of California, the nature and variety of its products are very like those of the middle western States. As in his home State he finds wheat and corn bordering on orchard and vineyard; he finds sparkling streams flowing through broad stretches of pasture land; he sees bands of sleek cattle grazing on fields of timothy, red-top, clover and alfalfa. He gazes on a sky-line broken by many towering silos and rounded hay stacks, and knows that all is well—he has found the land of his heart's desire.
