ing sentinel at the northern end is Mt. Tom, of lesser altitude than Whitney but of more symmetrical lines and of much charm.

Betweeen these two sentinels of the valley are several peaks of scarcely less distinction. Notable among these is Mt. Williamson with an altitude of 14,384 feet.

Fish and Game Over one hundred pineshadowed lakes and numerous flashing streams make this stretch
of the Sierras an unique and wonderfully
attractive playground—a playground over
one hundred miles long furnished by nature with every allurement for sportsmen and mountain lovers. Gamey trout
invite the fisherman to try his skill, the
waters being regularly stocked from the
Mt. Whitney fish hatchery, said to be the
most complete and modern hatchery in the
West. The mountains abound in game,
while excellent quail and duck shooting
is to be had in the valley.

Camping Spots Many delightful and picturesque camping spots, easily reached by automobile, are to be found and good mountain trails lead to the higher lakes and "back country."

Along El Camino Sierra are a number of well equipped mountain resorts where motor tourists and sportsmen may find comfortable quarters. Andrews Camp, situated on the upper waters of Bishop Creek, is a mountain "tent city" where comfortable and well furnished tent houses and cottages may be rented by those who prefer to do their mountain "housekeeping" under cover. From this camp trails lead to many beautiful lakes and to the King's River country on the western slope of the Sierras.

Raymer's Camp at Convict Lake provides accommodations similar to those of Andrew's Camp. It is located in a picturesque spot and is close to some of the best fishing ground in California.

In Mammoth Mountain Resorts country, in Mono county, the Mammoth Hotel provides excellent accommodations. Substantial and well furnished buildings and the best of mountain fare have made this resort a favorite stopping place. Mammoth is famous for its many beautiful lakes and its scenic attractions. It is but a short distance from the crest of the range, and pack outfits may be obtained for trips to the San Joaquin, the Devil's Postpile, Rainbow Falls and other scenic wonders. Excellent trout fishing is one of the many attractions of the Mammoth country.

All of these resorts are reached from Bishop over good mountain roads.
