

OWENS RIVER VALLEY

"NATURE'S CORNUCOPIA"

SHAPED as a huge cornucopia lying snugly between towering mountain ranges, the Owens River Valley is truly a horn of plenty. Richness of soil, an abundance of pure water and ideal climatic conditions serve to fill it to overflowing with nature's richest gifts.

This natural cornucopia runs a tapering course from north to south between the foothills for a distance of one hundred miles. Its mouth, which lies to the north, is twenty miles in diameter. Its southern end measures, approximately, six miles across.

Cattle, hogs, sheep, horses, hay, grain, fruits, butter, milk and honey are the principal contents of this horn of plenty.

The men who till the soil and conduct the business affairs of this prosperous and fertile valley are thorough Americans. The foreign population is very small.

Inyo county, in which the Owens River



Valley is situated, may well be proud of the character of its people. Perhaps in no other county of the State does old-time California hospitality prevail to such an extent as in this county of valleys and mountains, and in no other county of the State will be found a more liberal and enterprising people.
