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WILDERNESS VACATIONS

California's rough and rugged mountain regions contain great forest areas with an abundance of wildlife, rushing streams and mountain lakes teeming with trout, scenic beauty and recreational resources unsurpassed. These regions are to be found mainly within the boundaries of the National Forests and National Parks. In the National Forests alone vast areas totaling some 1,650,000 acres have been set aside as "wild" or "wilderness" in which no improvements are permitted. Likewise, practically all of the territory in the National Parks may be classed as wilderness, where fishing is permitted, but no hunting. It is to these regions, far from the maddening crowds and the odor of gasoline and accessible only by hiking or riding, that more and more people are turning each year for their recreation and for relaxation.

This booklet has been prepared to assist the many thousands of outdoor enthusiasts who seek this type of vacation, and to fulfill a real need for accurate and concise information on reliable packers throughout the State, their facilities, and the territory they cover.

Your trip may be as modest or as elaborate as your purse and time permit. You can ride for a day, or pack in over a weekend, a week, a month or longer. You can be taken to a designated camp site with your supplies and equipment and have the packer return for you at a stipulated time. Or, you can keep the guide and stock and make numerous interesting trips from your base camp. You can go as light as your

camping experience warrants and thus save the cost of additional stock, or you can go de luxe and have just as many extra luxuries as the stock can pack. Most packers have a lower rate for guide and pack stock after the first few days so that a longer vacation can still be economical.

While the summer vacation months are the most popular, the opening of the fishing season in the spring finds a large number of anglers packing in to trout-filled streams, and with the hunting season in the fall, numerous nimrods for deer, bear and mountain lion. Most packers operate from the opening to the close of the deer hunting season. As a rule, stock cannot be rented unless a guide accompanies it.

As to food and other supplies, given your specifications the packer can either supply it direct or arrange for all that you will need. Wearing apparel is no problem, as the roughest kind of outdoor clothes, the kind that "can take it" are in order. On such items and special equipment it is well to consult your packer in advance.

Prices may vary slightly from year to year and those given throughout this guide should be considered approximate until confirmed. As some of the pack outfits change hands occasionally but the pack station remains at the same location, address the pack station where possible, attention of the packer listed. It is always best to make your plans early, and to write for reservations as far in advance as possible.

Plan to take this most enjoyable type of vacation at your earliest opportunity.

GOVERNMENT FLAT PACK STATION. In Mendocino National Forest, via Highway 101 to Longvale or Highway 99 W to Paskenta. Operates from late May until end of deer season. Covers the virgin country north of Government Flat and Yolla Bolly Primitive Area. Parties taken to established camp sites where they stay as long as they like.
